

PhD Fellowship /Astrophysics

The Physics Department of the Catholic University of America (CUA) will be selecting candidates for PhD fellowships in Physics in 2008. Graduate students are expected to teach Physics for undergraduate students during the first 2 years and do research during the last 3 years.

The PhD thesis can be done in one of the following areas: astrophysics, nuclear physics, biophysics, materials sciences or condensed matter. The Physics Department at CUA hosts the Institute for Astrophysics and Computational Sciences which contains ~ 30 astrophysicists and solar physicists associated with Goddard Space Flight Center at NASA where the student can do the research in astrophysics.

The candidates should have a bachelor degree in Physics or Astronomy. A Master degree is not required. They should be proficient in English and present TOEFL and GRE (general) scores. The final selection will be made in March 2008 and the student is expected to start in August 2008.
